Challenge

- Health and care service providers and users increasingly facing complex decisions when exploring and investing in new health and care solutions.
- need to support cross-border cooperation
- balance innovation risks with improved outcomes and related unmet needs
- need for implementing high quality policies, strategies and practises in a concerted manner
- for more confidence in addressing key areas of interventions
- need to facilitate an appropriate dialogue with the supply side and academic stakeholders

SC1-HCC-04-2018 Digital health and care services – support for strategy and (early) adoption

Scope

- Create **favourable framework conditions** for cross-border Communities of Practice (CoP)
- **Assist the health & care research and innovation ecosystems in taking investment decisions** on future procurement of research and innovation and, eventually, on (large scale) deployment of eHealth systems and new care delivery models.
- **Improve the maturity of the new products** emerging from Europe's leading Health ICT SMEs
- **Support for management of risk and diverging expectations** in innovation chain
- **consumer health** interlinked with institutional health and care
- **findings in earlier co-ordination and support actions** for procurers as listed in WP

Some definitions and taxonomy in simplistic terms:

Key Performance Areas (KPA) – in health and care services

- **Value proposition** – quality of health and care (clinical evidence,TRL)
- **Operational excellence** – sustainability
- **Economic value** – savings and profit

Open Innovation 2 (OI2)

- Open **dialogue between multiple actor types (user, service provider, supplier and academia)**;
- **Optimising multiple KPAs in market consultation** and knowledge brokerage settings between the actor types
- **Managing expectations and risks** of highly theme and actor specific Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) under the three KPA categories

Collaborative innovation

- Same as OI2 but less actors may be involved

Collaborative research

- Mostly **focus on Value proposition category** (Proof-of-concept)
- **One directional exploitation** model

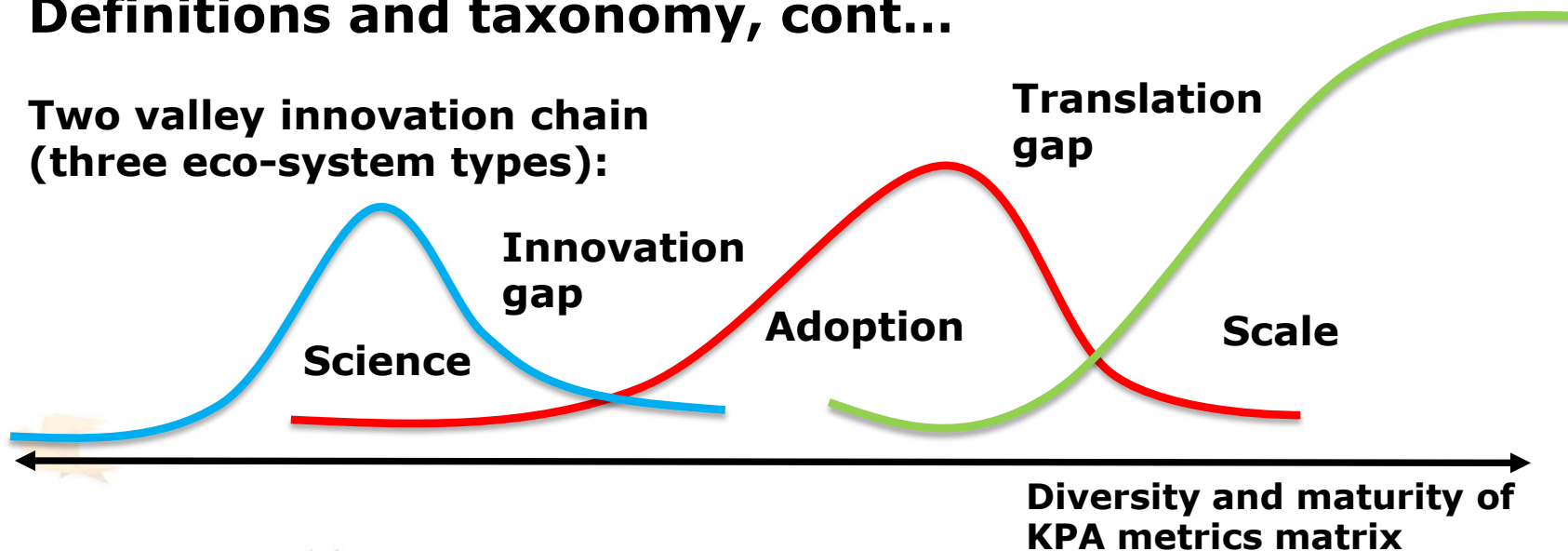

(1) Framework for thematic Communities of Practice in digital health and care services: user driven cross-sectoral growth strategy; integrating data strategy; linking research institutions and university hospitals; education; building upon national initiatives; repositories of methodologies

Expected Impact

- **Concerted approach** and solutions to the challenges faced by the health and care ecosystems as perceived by service providers and users in EU
- Well addressed unmet needs, reduced fragmentation
- Evidences of support and collaboration with consortia developing unmet needs for innovation procurement and **implementation aspects** beyond the innovation procurement procedures
- **Concrete preparation of a cross-border PCP** for at least one shared common procurement need

Challenge

- **pressure on governments** to provide cost-effective health and care systems by improving utilisation of **healthcare and health outcomes**
- **network, lead and facilitate health systems research**, innovation and digitisation in view of **addressing key areas of interventions in health and care services** including health promotion and disease prevention.

SC1-DTH-10-2019 Digital health and care services (PCP)

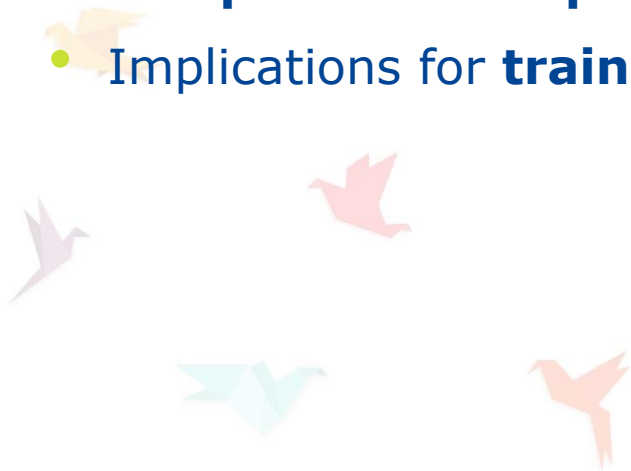
Scope

- Support the health and care **service provider to procure industrial R&D services**
- Testing and implementation of digital services and communication concepts that can facilitate **the transition to integrated care models across health and social services**
- **Key areas** that could be addressed: **patient empowerment, self-management, patient safety, patient involvement, chronic disease management, diagnosing, hospital and home care logistics, skills and independent living**
- Country-specific cross-institutional set-ups
- Includes decentralised procurement environments and collaboration across institutions

SC1-DTH-10-2019 Digital health and care services (PCP)

Scope, cont...

- Driven by clearly identified user needs
- Demonstrate strong commitment of **end-users**
- As applicable contribute to the use of **interoperable** solutions
- Compliance with **ethical** standards and **privacy** protection
- Include robust time-lines, a well-structured work-plan, **compliance with procedures**
- Implications for **training**



SC1-DTH-10-2019 Digital health and care services (PCP)

Expected Impact

- **Evidences in Key Performance Areas** i.e., quality in health and care, sustainability of the delivery system and economic value
- Improved **user and market engagement**
- **Strengthened procurement community**
- **Evidence of benefits of disruptive technologies**
- Increased opportunities for solution uptake across **wider international procurement markets by aiming at interoperable solutions**
- Evidence of a healthy innovation ecosystem

SC1-DTH-10-2019 Digital health and care services (PCP)

Deadline, Budgets, Thresholds

- Submission **Deadline: 14 Nov 2018** at 17:00 (Brussels local time, double check from final version)*
- Total Call Budgets:
 - 22 million € (EC contribution: maximum **90% of the total eligible costs**)
 - proposals requesting a contribution from the EU of around **€5-6M would allow this specific challenge to be addressed appropriately**. Nonetheless, this does not preclude submission and selection of proposals **requesting other amounts**.
 - Proposals of this topic should follow the specific requirements for pre-commercial procurement (PCP) supported by Horizon 2020 grants as set out in Annex E of the WP
 - Cumulative threshold: 10 (3/3/3)

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SC1-DTH-05-2019: Large scale implementation of digital innovation for health and care in an ageing society

Challenge

- An ageing population is **increasing demand-side pressures** on public health and social care providers across Europe.
- Pressures **undermine the long-term sustainability** of existing models for delivering care services to the ageing population.
- Digital solutions which have been tested and have demonstrated success in smaller scale settings... BUT... **large-scale deployment** across EU borders remains limited

SC1-DTH-05-2019: Large scale implementation of digital innovation for health and care in an ageing society

Scope

- Contribute to:
 - the **Digital Single Market Strategy** priorities on digital transformation of health and care (notably to the priority on user-centred integrated care),
 - the **Scaling-Up Strategy of the European Innovation Partnership on Active and Healthy Ageing** (EIP on AHA) on user-centred integrated care
- Target **large-scale deployment of integrated digital health and social care solutions** across different regions in Europe.
- **Specify, purchase and deploy ICT based solutions** (made up of services and ICT products to enable the provision of services) for active and healthy ageing
- Through a **common supply and demand side dialogue**, which can deliver sustainable, new or improved health and social care services promoting patient feedback in which public procurement approaches for innovative solutions lead to improved outcomes.

SC1-DTH-05-2019: Large scale implementation of digital innovation for health and care in an ageing society

Scope, cont...

- Be driven by **clearly identified procurement needs** of the participating organisations and building on a deep understanding of the needs of the ageing population, as well as the needs of the relevant health and care providers;
- Support **sustainable deployment of new or improved person-centred and outcome-based services** promoting patient feedback by providers involved in the procurement of solutions for digital health and care providers;
- Specify measures that will ensure the **sustainability of solutions beyond the lifespan of the proposed project**
- Engage **public (and eventually private) procurers** from each country participating (at national, regional or local level) that have responsibilities and budget control in the relevant area of care or supply of services;
- Be based on a **complete set of common specifications for end to end services**;

Scope, cont...

- Demonstrate that the **implementation phase will reach "large scale"** (i.e. sufficient scale to achieve statistical significance) through region-wide deployment across multiple regions of Europe;
- Contribute to the **use of interoperable solutions based on open platforms** and take into account existing best practices and standardisation initiatives;
- Provide **robust safeguards to ensure compliance with ethical standards and privacy protections** and take account of the gender dimension;
- Contribute with good outcome-based practices that are impact measured according to the **MAFEIP methodology** and can be made available for replication across other regions through the EIP on AHA innovative practices repository.
- Contribute to the **development of national strategies** to stimulate the procurement of digital innovation for health and care services based on the outcomes achieved at national level.

Expected Impact

- **Growing awareness and successful use of public procurement** to boost ICT innovation applied to integrated care and active and healthy ageing, implemented across the whole chain of care ultimately benefiting the growing ageing population across Europe;
- **Contribution with data and experiences to regulatory and legislative process** development addressing potential barriers to procurement of innovative solutions for active and healthy ageing;
- Contribution of an **open and comprehensive socio-economic evidence base for ICT investments** in the field that can support the development of sustainable business models (e.g. cost-benefit analysis, increased efficiency of health and care systems, impact assessments, return on investments, quality of life improvements for users, ethics, safety gain and user satisfaction);
- Support initiatives on **interoperability and standardisation** that can contribute to defragmentation of the market for ICT based active and healthy ageing solutions;

Expected Impact

- Creation of economic boundary conditions that can support **long-term sustainability of health and care systems and emergence of new business models** to develop ICT innovation for active and healthy ageing in Europe;
- Support forward-looking, **concerted public-sector investment strategies** that benefit from joint approaches across different regions;
- Create **new opportunities for market uptake** and economies of scale for the supply side for ICT based solutions and services for active and healthy ageing in a Digital Single Market for Europe.
- Contribute to **inform policy measures** that foster the take-up of ICT solutions for active and healthy ageing.
